

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ'S) ABOUT FLICKR

How do I rename a set?

You can rename a set that you created by going to your Flickr home page, then click on "Organize", then on "Sets & Collections" tab, and then on the name of the set you want to rename ("New Set" in your case). This opens a view of the particular set. On the left is a box with the set name ("New Set"). Just click in that box and backspace or delete the old name and type another name for the set. Then click the SAVE button on the lower left. That will rename the set without moving or deleting photos.

When you look at your own sets, you won't see your name under the sets. You will see other Flickr users' photos with their user name under the photos ("From minmor_farms", for example). But Flickr assumes you know that your photos are from you, so no user name is under them. You can put a description under each of your photos, such as the name of the horse or file.

Are Flickr photos "linked"?

The way Flickr works, anyone can be given permission to see your photos by you adding them as a contact (friend or family). You invite them to be a contact, using the Flickr "Invite" button on your "Contacts" page. I invited you to be a friend, and you signed up, so that's why you can see my photos and I can see your "friend" photos. Public photos, that is, photos not limited by their owner to viewing only by friends or family, can be seen and found by searching on tags by anyone on the Internet.

Should I add more of my own horse photos?

Absolutely. I'm hoping to build up a larger collection of photos showing flaxen and non-flaxen chestnut Morgans, correctly named (AMHA name & number), tagged and described, as I explained in my instructions, so that UC Davis has a large sample upon which DNA research can be done. It takes a lot of data to find the genes.

How do I move photos to a different set?

1. Login to Flickr.
2. Click on "Your Photos".
3. Click on the set that has the photos you want to move.
4. Click on first photo in that set.
5. Click on "Add to set" tab above the photo.
6. A list of your sets will drop down. Click on the set it should be in.
7. On that same drop down list, click on the [x] after the name of the set in which it doesn't belong.
8. Repeat this for each photo.

When a set is empty, how do I delete the empty set?

Home > Your Photos > Sets > Edit (under the empty set) > Batch edit > Delete this set.

Can I add photos to someone else's photo sets on his or her Flickr album?

Flickr doesn't allow "friends" to add photos to sets that are on other people's albums. They only can add their new photos to their own album and put them into sets to organize them. Friends can see your photos if you list them as a friend and you make photos available to view by your friends.

How many sets can I make?

The free Flickr account allows 3 sets. If you want more than 3, you need a paid subscription to Flickr. It's not very expensive. Consult the Flickr site for instruction on subscribing.
